Black decides first whether to force the game into an isolated queen pawn position. If so, he can either try to aggressively attack the queen pawn with the Kirilov Gambit (line 1) or Schlechter Variation (line 2,) or play the traditional IQP blockade game that also comes about from a Queen's Gambit Accepted or Panov-Botvinnik Caro Kann. If black decides not to exchange his c-pawn for the d-pawn to create the isolani, then he risks white playing d4xc5 at an inopportune time. In the Two Knights Variation (lines 5 and 6) and the Lane Variation (lines 7 and 8), black will have to decide whether to exchange queens with a difficult gambit, or to lose time by taking back the pawn on c5. The latter creates pawn majorities on opposite sides, with black's queen getting harassed early.




#1 Kirillov Gambit



#2 Schlechter Variation




#3 &amp; #4 Isolated Queen Pawn



## Early exchange 4... c5xd4

### § 1 - 4: Early IQP Variation

Black's immediate exchange of pawns is forcing - it achieves the isolated queen pawn structure - but it also allows white's knight to develop on c3, gaining time by attacking the queen. Perhaps the loss of time was inevitable.



The classic IQP positions popularized by Steinitz and Botvinnik can be reached by 6 ... e6 or 6 ... Qc6 7 Qf3 e6. What if black tries to break out of those positions? He can either develop his queen bishop outside the pawn structure, that is, before playing ... e6, or he can immediately counter in the center with ... e5.

#### 1. 6 ... Qc6 7 Qf3 Qg4

Aggressively going after the d-pawn.

#### 2. 6 ... Qc6 7 Qf3 e5

Schlechter's idea of hitting the center.

#### 3. 6 ... e6

Lines where black plays Bb4xc3 creating an isolated pawn duo in the center. (Keeping the IQP structure is examined in line 4.)
